

# Nebraska Income Tax E-File



## ***How to start e-filing Nebraska returns***

Since Nebraska does not require a state registration, all you have to do is enroll in the IRS E-file program, and make sure that you have software that supports filing for Nebraska state returns. Go to [www.irs.gov/efile/index.htm](http://www.irs.gov/efile/index.htm) to register with the IRS. See the reverse side for a list of Nebraska-approved professional software products.

## ***Where to find state e-file information***

The Nebraska Department of Revenue provides a variety of information for tax professionals who are Electronic Return Originators (EROs). This information is posted on our Information for Tax Professionals page and at other locations on our Web site:

- 2008 State Handbook (Publication 1345N): This describes how the Nebraska program works, along with rules and tips on becoming a successful Nebraska ERO (not available until approximately October 15).
- 2008 Nebraska E-file Reject Codes: Use this as a reference for troubleshooting errors on rejected state returns.
- 2008 Public High School District Codes: This provides a complete listing of high school district codes by county.
- Form 8453N – Nebraska Individual Income Tax Transmittal: This form is produced by your software, and is intended to be used as a cover sheet for tax forms that must be mailed in to the Department.
- Form 1040N-V – Nebraska Individual Income Tax Payment Voucher (used only with electronically filed returns): If the taxpayer does not want to pay electronically, use this form to attach payment and mail to the Department.
- Bulletins, regulations, information guides, research reports, publications and preparer tips: We post the latest e-file changes and helpful tips on preparing Nebraska returns.


